Belgacom creates two units for corporate market

Belgacom launches two new units in its Wireline Business Unit. A new Network and System Integration unit will be created to provide companies with total solutions for their internal and external communications. This will enable Belgacom to respond to increasing corporate demand for integrated solutions. This unit will be managed by Peter Van Gaelen, who is currently the director of the Corporate & Data Solutions' customer service department. He will report to Pascal Methens. A separate PABX unit is also being set up. This will group all activities related to corporate communications systems and private telephone exchanges. Jean Gabriel will take on the management of the new PABX entity, and report to Pascal Methens. Jean Gabriel will also continue to lead WIN SA, of which he has been the CEO since May 2000. Both projects have been submitted to the trade unions, in order to discuss the consequences for the employees involved. The projects are expected to start at the beginning of January.
